Core

Following on from the success of providing training online, Camden Learning will continue to offer virtual CPD training courses. Online training has proved popular, and attendance has been significantly higher in many online training sessions.

Venue information will be available when courses are booked through the CPD site. For our face to face training sessions, we are continuing to make use of Camden schools as well as the Camden Learning Centre.

CPD courses that are face to face will continue to be in schools. Schools have been chosen for their accessibility; all are within a ten minute walk of an Underground or Overground station and many also have excellent bus

links. As there is extremely limited and often no car parking at schools, it is highly recommended that you use public transport. If this is not possible, please contact the school in advance of the session to request if there is car parking available nearby. Please see the map on page 7 showing the location of each school at which training courses are located.

What does this event cover?

Essential training for every workplace

The Fire Warden Training covers many aspects of a building evacuation including Means of Escape; The Responsible Person; Fire Warden responsibilities; Muster Points; Fire Telephones; Health and Safety Legislation and fire prevention.

Course overview

The course typically lasts 2.5 to 3 hours and takes the form of a PowerPoint presentation and a practical Fire Extinguisher demonstration with a live fire rig where space allows. A video demonstration is an alternative. Safeguarding

Camden Safeguarding Children Partnership (CSCP) is made up of representatives from statutory, voluntary and community organisations and services. It ensures the coordination of safeguarding work by all agencies and monitors the effectiveness of child protection work across the local authority area.

Camden Learning works in partnership with the CSCP to promote effective safeguarding practice in all Camden schools and settings.

Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL)



All schools should ensure an appropriate senior member of staff is appointed to the role of DSL, supported by a minimum of one Deputy DSL. This role is to take lead responsibility for safeguarding and child protection within their school and to be available during school hours for staff to discuss safeguarding concerns.

New DSL appointments are required to attend DSL induction training, provided by Lynne Rigg (Independent Safeguarding and Child Protection Training Consultant), on behalf of the CSCP.

Experienced DSLs should attend refresher training every two years.

Should on rare occasions the DSL have missed the timeframe for training, completion of an online training module will satisfy compliance regulations. The expectation is for the DSL to enrol on the next available refresher course.

It is the responsibility of the DSL to:

1. Attend regular additional training, including Prevent awareness training
2. Attend termly DSL meetings in order to keep up to date with new guidance and emerging issues
3. Provide all staff with regular updates on any changes in safeguarding or child protection legislation or guidance
4. Ensure all staff, including temporary staff, receive safeguarding and child protection training at least every 2 years.

Secondary Networks

Secondary Moderation/Network Package



With the ever-changing landscape around secondary assessments and the importance of teacher assessment, the secondary network and moderation group has changed its emphasis going forward. The key question remains around how we share knowledge and expertise between Camden schools and how we can support moderation to increase confidence in accuracy of assessments.

As a school-led system Camden Learning are adapting the approach for the next school improvement package period. We will be recruiting secondary subject network leads to oversee the programme of network half-termly meetings which will now include coordination and quality assurance. Network leads will be trained to establish and deliver their programmes so that there is consistency across the groups and in the networks' knowledge and progression maps. This package also entitles secondary schools to attend regular moderation sessions throughout the academic year, with multiple representation from schools if desired. These will be led by the designated network leads.

- CPD leads, English, Maths, History, Geography, Art, Drama and Dance, Design Technology, MFL, PE, and RE subject specific meetings throughout the course of the academic year
- This package will also include Heads of Sixth Form, Data Manager and Exam leads' meetings – Chaired by Camden Learning (Jon Abbey and Kellyanne Wray)
- Please note, this package DOES NOT include attendance at SENDCO forums, these can be booked separately through the Camden Learning CPD site as training
- Peer network for sharing subject specific expertise and course delivery support
- Access to subject moderation meetings throughout the course of the year including peer challenge around grading

SBM Hub
