Councillor Marcus Boyland, Camden Council's Cabinet Member for Best Start for Children and Families In 2022 just 51% of disadvantaged year 2 pupils in England achieved the expected standard in Reading. This means that 49% of disadvantaged 7-year olds had already fallen behind by the age of 7!*

In Camden we do better^{**} *but* there are still many disadvantaged pupils who face significant barriers and fall behind. These children urgently need additional support.
