Published Statistics: Pupil Attendance in Schools

- Information on the <u>levels of overall</u>, <u>authorised and unauthorised absence</u> in state-funded primary, secondary and special schools from September 2022 onwards is published each week. The data includes daily, weekly and year-to-date information on attendance and absence, in addition to reasons for absence.
- The figures are published as experimental official statistics to give an indicative figure for the absence rate during the 2023/24 academic year. A national level figure was published on 7 September 2023 and from 28 September 2023 the <u>pupil attendance dashboard</u> will be updated fortnightly, providing aggregate metrics on overall absence and reasons for absence estimated at national, regional and local authority level only.

This will also give you, your local authority and your multi-academy trust (if applicable) <u>access to daily attendance reports</u> to help identify pupils needing attendance support earlier.

 authority. This has been updated to show data for this
 current academic year. Use it to compare absence and
 unauthorised absence for your school, as well as special
 educational needs and free school meals pupils

This release covers the period 11 September 2023 to 23 February 2024, with data relating to 5-15 year olds in state funded primary, secondary and special schools in England.

Education Policy Institute report: Outcomes for young people who experience multiple suspensions.

Findings:

- Pupils with even one suspension are, on average, not achieving a standard pass in GCSE English and maths
- Pupils with multiple suspensions have poorer education outcomes.
- The proportion of pupils identified with special education needs or disabilities (SEND) increases in line with the number of suspensions.

- structured mentor meetings are the most valued pedagogical component of the ECF programme
- more likely to experience higher levels of job
- satisfaction and well-being at school
- positively and directly influences their retention decisions

FFT/datalab: How does absence change as pupils get older? Findings:

- changes in absence rates from one year to the next varied by year group. The biggest drops were among the very youngest pupils, moving from Reception into Year 1, while the biggest rises were among those moving from Year 7 into 8, and Year 8 into 9
- a relationship between changes in absence and pupil characteristics, particularly among secondary pupils.

NfER: Teacher Labour Market in England Annual Report 2024

- Secondary ITT recruitment in 2023/24 reached only half of its target
- Working hours increased significantly in 2022/23 compared to the previous year
- Last year's pay award helped to stall the real-terms fall in teacher pay since 2010/11. However, teacher pay growth has been outstripped by strong earnings growth since the pandemic in the wider labour market
- Flexible working has become more common in teaching, but remote and hybrid working is limited. Compensating frontline public sector workers could help prevent the lack of remote working from undermining the attractiveness of these jobs.
